Thank you everyone who attended and contributed to making these gatherings so special. It would not happen without YOU! It feels good volunteering and working for the betterment of our community. 

Discovering Key West Woman's Club By Kathleen Arenz



On a recent trip to the Florida Keys with my husband, our favorite stop was definitely Key West. In addition to places like Hemingway's home and the Truman Little White House, I was delighted to discover the Key West Woman's Club (KWWC). I enthusiastically took advantage of a tour and enjoyed it all the more when the club member leading it said she was a snowbird from Minocqua, Wisconsin!

Sue from Minocqua is one of the 200 members of the club which was founded in 1915 and which is a member of the General Federation of Womens Clubs. Its mission is to provide funding for local charities and one international organization. Members work diligently to discern needs within the community and to take action.

The KWWC clubhouse is a stately Victorian red brick home built in 1892 for Captain Martin Hellings and his wife, Eleanor Curry Hellings, two prominent early Floridians, and is lavishly furnished with the original furniture and decorative objects. Since 1940 this historic home has been the clubhouse for the Woman's Club.

Although club meetings are held at the house, its main purpose is as the club's revenue source. The house is ideal for weddings and events, and the large kitchen is known for its fine food. The day I was there an elaborate bridal shower was being set up. While not a reciprocal club due to the absence of dining or sleeping facilities, KWWC welcomes visitors interested in touring the house which is a Florida heritage site. It's definitely worth a look the next time your travels take you to Key West.
