

This year brings exciting updates to the card!

First, we are going COLOR!!

First, we're going full color! When the card launched 19 years ago, it featured around 10 restaurants and was priced at \$95. Now, with 32 restaurants and 8 theaters/venues, and after more than a decade without any price adjustments, we've decided to raise the price to \$120. Remember, 100% of these proceeds go directly to local charities.

In response to feedback from participating restaurants, we're also introducing two new restrictions:

- A maximum of 2 cards per table.
- Restaurants may add a gratuity of up to 20% based on the original check total.

Although we lost 8 restaurants for various reasons, we're excited to announce the addition of 6 new restaurants and 2 new theaters/venues.

We greatly appreciate our restaurants and servers and are committed to ensuring a fantastic experience for everyone!

# A NOTE FROM OUR TREASURER

### Saving Eleanor Donations

With the year end approaching, we would like to point out that Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from traditional IRAs are a tax-efficient way to donate to Saving Eleanor, as we are a 501(c)(3) charity. You must be 70½ or older to qualify.

QCDs do not count as taxable income. It satisfies as a Required Minimum Distribution (RMDs)

for those age 73 or older. The donation must be directly

transferred to our club. An invoice for the donation can be provided upon request.


