What causes are important to you?

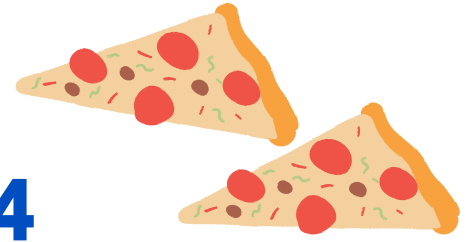

Kids events are also included by KWWC and KW Art and Historical Society. Most Events are free, some have a small cost, so that KWWC can recover our costs.

Enjoy Food by our wonderful KWWC and Martha Hubbard, and the New Key West Cooking School- all from the Key West Woman's Club 2025 Cookbook! We do need more volunteers to make appetizers for Day 2 and help with the day's events. Below is a summary of the Celebration:

Pre-Event, Wednesday April 2: Celebrating historic Key West Films-Wonderful movie at the Tropic Cinema, opening with "Reap the Wild Wind"

Day 1, Thursday April 3: Celebrating our Legacy. "Women Get Things Done!". KWWC 110 Anniversary Opening Ceremony to the Public and KWWC, Key note Speaker, Susan Mitchell. Our history and leadership in the Key West Community since 1915. Don't miss the Cannon down the street and our KW Tradition of Blowing the Conch! Don't miss the Panel Discussion by KWWC President Aundrea and Ancestors of the Curry Family, including Eleanor Curry's great grand-daughter Nicole Curry Jones and our very own 7th generation Conch, Clinton Curry. Appetizers by the New Key West Cooking School, opening in March.

Day 2, Friday April 4: A Walk Through Time. History, History, History: Dr. Cori Convertito and the Key West Art and Historical Society kick this day off with twos walking tours of the Curry Family Homes and other historical building in the context of KW history. This also includes a tour into the Curry Mansion given by our own PJ Eaton. Historic Tours of America provides a Trolley Tour that includes the Curry Homes, Key West historical sites, a stop to hear Dr. Corey Malcom, Historian at the Monroe County Library tell the Historic Leadership role of KWWC in Key West, as stop at the Bahama Village Historic American Legion Hall, where our own Nancy Moulton tells the importance of this historic building. Two drop off spots: The Eco Discovery Center and the Harry Truman Little White House. But wait...there is more- Dr. Cori Convertito will have a presentation and panel at the Tropic Cinema: Echoes of the Island: Growing up in Key West, with Clayton Lopez, City Commissioner, Alex Vega, Director of the Alex Vega Historic Fire House Museum and Teresa Menendez, Business Women.

Join us for an "After Party" with an Open bar, and Appetizers and dance to the Privateers.

Day 3, Saturday, April 5: Festival Days and Island Nights. A day of fun-filled events celebrating all Key West. Docent tours, art by the KWAC, Local and KWWC vendors, Children's Events, Conch Cooking Competition by participants, a Culinary -History of Food in Key West Panel, by our own Roberta Isleib that includes, Dr. Cori Converitito, Conch Analise Andrews, and our own Marth Hubbard. Enjoy tasting by Martha. Raffle winners will be announced. Dance to Conch Fusions: our Key West local band of conchs: Henry Fuller, Clayton and Mina Lopez, and others in our local community.

Day 4, Sunday, April 6: High Tea of Years Gone By. Continuing the 110th Anniversary Celebration of the KWWC, enjoy the charm of High Tea celebrated at the KWWC, with tea, champagne, and finger sandwiches and delectable sweets. Women can dress up in early 1900's millinery and men in boaters and bow ties.

Alex Vega Fire Museum – to support their preservation of Firehouse #3 and their collection of artifacts.

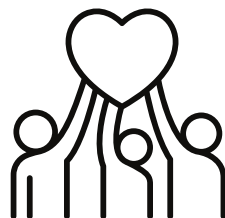

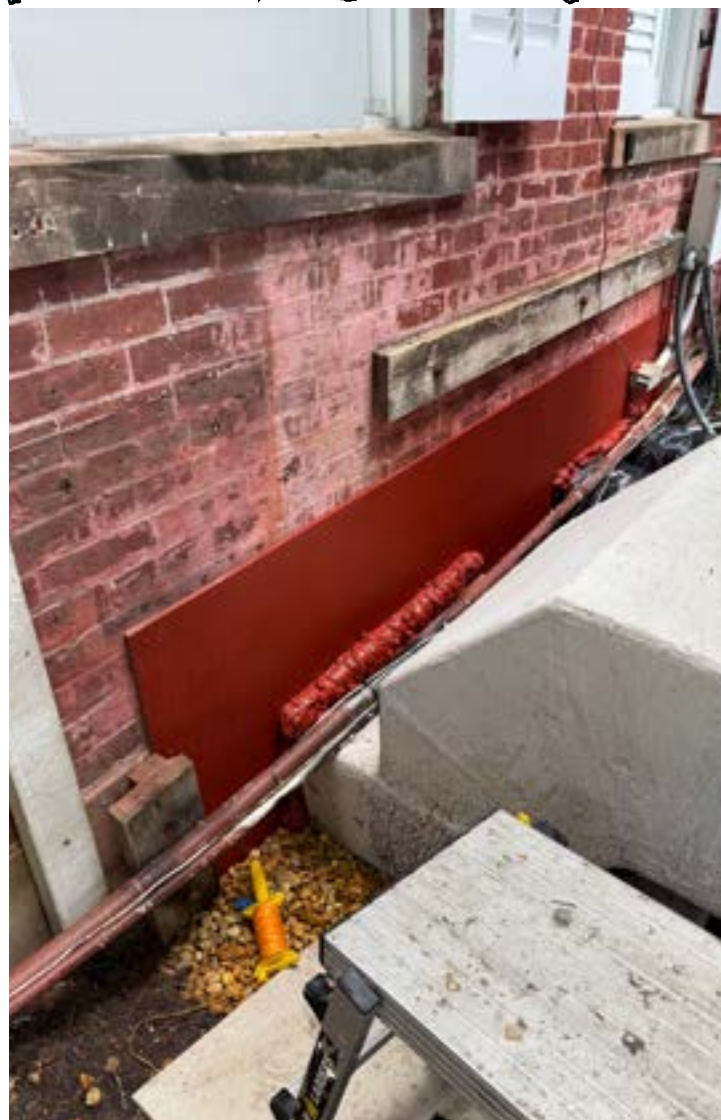

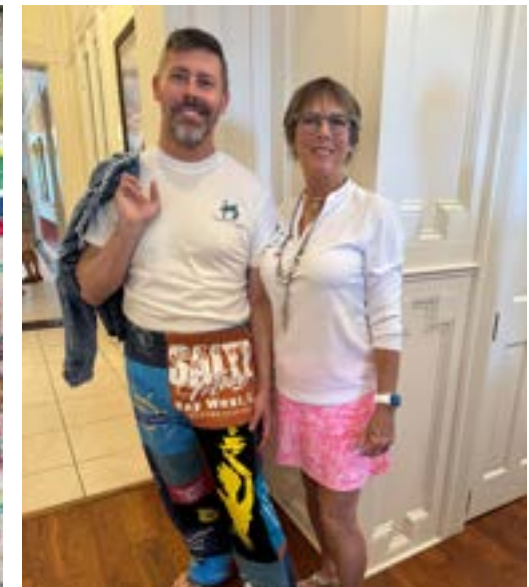
